Scam Targets FBEMC Members

Scammers Seek Upfront Payment from Co-op Members

Some FBEMC customers have informed us that a scammer has been contacting them claiming to be a utility employee in order to get money illegally from them. The latest calls say they are from FBEMC and they pretend they are calling to let you know your account is delinquent and unless you pay right away the service will be disconnected.

Even though the caller might insist he/she is with French Broad EMC or another utility please know that we would not call you and demand you to pay us immediately over the phone or risk having your power disconnected and we would never do this on the weekend. French Broad EMC will also never call and demand payment via a prepaid debit card or wire transfer.

Delinquent notices are included on our customer billing statements when an account is delinquent except for FlexPay accounts. If you get a questionable call like this and are concerned about your account, please hang up and call FBEMC directly at the number below. Do not use the number that is on your caller ID to call the person back.

Additionally, due to Executive Order No. 142 due to the COVID-19 crisis, utility shut-offs are currently prohibited until August 1st. As always, please call our office at (828) 649-2051 if you have questions or concerns.

Keep cool and save on HVAC costs

When it's hot, it's tempting to crank the thermostat way down. But wait! Air conditioning is a leading culprit of higher energy bills in the summer. Prevent your AC from using more energy than necessary, keep your home more comfortable, and save money all at the same time, with these simple ideas:

- · Change air filters regularly, at least every 3 months. Dirty filters make your system work harder.
- Tune up your HVAC equipment yearly to improve efficiency and comfort.
- · Make sure air ducts are sealed and insulated.
- Install a smart thermostat. These devices keep energy use at a minimum, and comfort at a maximum, by automatically customizing cooling schedules to fit your life. They can also be adjusted from a mobile app.

Keep in mind that if your unit is older, or improperly sized, it may not be running as efficiently as a newer, properly-sized model could. When buying a new air conditioner, consider an energy-efficient model for savings that will last as long as you own the system.

And all summer long, resist the urge to lower that temperature setting! It won't cool the house any faster, but it will use extra energy. Keep the thermostat set to the temperature you want inside, or even a few degrees higher for additional savings.

Manager's Report

Good News in a Hard Times

It's fair to assess that the first half of 2020 has been a time of trial and tribulation. When the year started, we were full of optimism that everything would continue just as it had ended in 2019. Businesses were profitable. unemployment was at an all time low, gas prices were down, and Americans were going and doing more than ever. Then the COVID-19 pandemic hit, and the world turned upside down. It has been almost 5 months now and we still have a long way to go to get back to "normal". Each day, it seems we hear of nothing but bad news and negative stories.

While it certainly doesn't change the current situation we are in, French Broad EMC is happy to report some good news! If you remember, back in 2018 your Board of Directors entered into a new wholesale power agreement with Duke Energy, bringing every member instant savings on their power bills. This contract was structured to more adequately match our load curve and essentially recognize our lack of demand on the system in the summer peaking hours. With that, we have been able to give a credit to our members every month so far in 2020. The total credit through the end of June totaled over

\$2.7 million dollars and shows up on the monthly Purchased Power and Fuel Adjustment (PPAF) line item. Even better news is that our fuel and demand costs were actually lower than estimated, which will result in additional credits throughout the remainder of 2020! In total, French Broad EMC will be refunding over \$4 million dollars to its membership in 2020.

This is one of the many benefits of being a member of an electric cooperative. We are here to serve our membership, not stock holders. Any extra revenue is returned to our membership in the form of PPAF credits and annual capital credit refunds. As a non-profit electric cooperative, we are required to collect enough revenue to pay all our debts plus have enough margin reserve to satisfy the Rural Utility Service (RUS) since we borrow money from their agency. Any margins above this level are given back to each member.

The credits given back through the PPAF this year are a result of lower than expected fuel and generation costs and also lower than expected coal ash expenses. This is not the case each year, however it could not have come at a

better time for many of our members.

Also, keep in mind that FBEMC will resume disconnections for non-payment as the governor's executive order is set to end July 31st. Please contact your local office in advance to set up payment arrangements to avoid any interruption in service. If you haven't done so already, you can sign up for our Flex-Pay account that will automatically set arrangements for you, making it simple to finance any amount you may currently owe.

Update Your Contact Information

Please be sure to notify your local FBEMC office when any of your contact information changes.

Customers are notified of their FlexPay balances, electronic bills, pending disconnects, scheduled outages, etc. via email, text message and/or voicemail.

It is important that we keep our records updated, should we need to contact you.
